Scholarship of Mary Eliza Haweis, 1848-1898 Mary Flowers Braswell, 2016-06-17 The author of numerous books on Geoffrey Chaucer, the nineteenth-century scholar Mary Eliza Haweis has been largely erased from general histories of Chaucer studies.
