Mercury and Mars have no suitable atmosphere to breathe, while Venus holds an atmosphere so thick in carbon dioxide it would kill humans. The other 4 planets, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune, are made of gas and cannot support land dwelling.

do many of the same things as conscious individuals the question is invited of why consciousness is required at all If you don't know what consciousness is how can you expand your consciousness to the maximum Wouldn't you like to be maximally conscious Think of the power you would have
