A. Nature and Appeal of Popular Literature

While "Popular Literature" was published and widely read in the 19th Century, by the 20th Century it had become a world unto itself. During the 20th Century, the growth of readership and genres in "Popular Literature" made "Literary" Literature seems like a small and exclusive "academic and scholarly" market. The ratio of sales told it all: Popular Literature comprised almost 90 % of the market for fiction.

When we think about literature at all, we tend to think of the famous authors who were "literary" writers such as Hemingway and Faulkner - but average folks across the globe were buying and reading fiction in great numbers - and they didn't stick to the "classic" names. Moreover, many "popular" writers became just as well known as the literary authors!
