Hazard Communication

All employers are required by the Hazard Communication Standard (HCS) to notify and train their workers on the hazardous chemicals to which they may be exposed at the time of their initial assignment and at any time a new hazard is added to their work environment.

02

Bloodborne Pathogens

Employers must take measures to control exposure to bloodborne pathogens in the workplace. This establishes protections to defend employees against health risks associated with bloodborne pathogens.



Personal Protective Equipment

Personal protective equipment, or "PPE," is the clothing worn to reduce exposure to risks that might result in significant workplace diseases and injuries.

Electrical Safety

When working with hazardous electrical systems, OSHA mandates the use of the appropriate electrical safety equipment. The design, labeling, and testing specifications for electrical safety devices are covered by this standard.

Machine Guarding

Where possible, guards should be attached to the machine; if this is not practicable for any reason, they should be secured elsewhere. The protection must be designed so that it does not present a risk of accidents on its own.

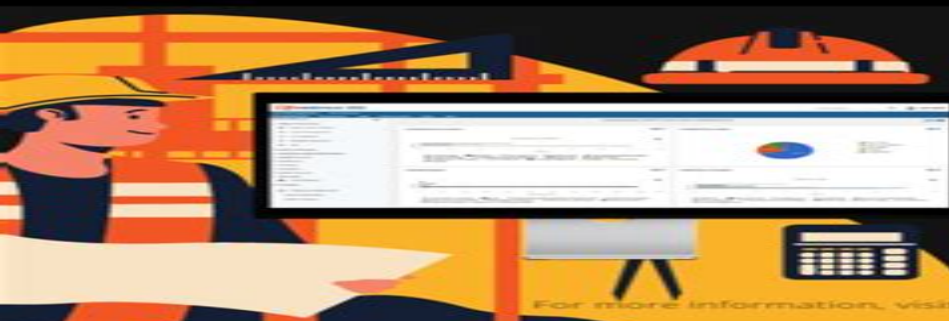
Ergonomics

Workplace conditions that deteriorate the body over time and increase the chance of harm are known as ergonomic risk factors. These include repetitive motion, unnatural posture, forceful movement, stillness, direct pressure, vibration, suffocating heat, loud noise, and work stress.

Construction Safety

Employees on construction sites should be provided with safety equipment. For example, hard hats, protective eyewear, and dust masks. It also involves adequate training to ensure safe work practices.
