Most poor countries experience growth and are able to finance development with homegrown resources or in collaboration with non-Western partners. Having other options, they may increasingly challenge and reject Western aid if it is accompanied with goals of transforming the recipients based on Western blueprints. The authors claim that aid has a role in the fight against poverty in the future but only if Western donors are willing to adapt to the new world order, leave paternalism behind, and rethink their role in development. Donors must change the way they relate to poor sovereign states, redefine the meaning of development.
